## High-level conference on the second EDCTP programme

5 November 2012 Cape Town, South Africa

This high-level conference will mark an important step in the consultation of African and international stakeholders on the second EDCTP programme (EDCTP2, 2014-2024) and in rising additional public/private engagement and support to EDCTP. It will provide a forum to discuss stakeholders needs, opportunities and expectations in EDCTP2, as well as to provide endorsement and announce commitments and pledges.

Specifically, the following four strategic key issues as regards EDCTP2 will be addressed and conclusions sought: 1) lessons learnt from EDCTP1, 2) the scope of EDCTP2, 3) the role and commitment of the participating European and African countries, 4) the private sector's participation and engagement in EDCTP2, in particular of industries, foundations and charities.

The speakers and audience will include European, African and international high-level speakers from policy, industry, patient organisations, non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and research. A total of approximately 200 participants are expected.

After the conference, a conclusive conference report will be prepared, summarising the key issues discussed, the up-front commitments provided, and draw conclusions which will feed into the next steps of the preparation for the EDCTP2 programme.

The conference is organised jointly by the South African Department for Science & Technology and the European Commission on the occasion of the 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the S&T cooperation agreement between the European Union and South Africa.
